Direct Response: We sent the CDP (formerly Carbon Disclosure Project) Supply Chain Climate Questionnaire to 197 third parties, which collectively represented 75% of our supply chain spend in 2020. 90% of these third parties responded to the questionnaire. Additionally, as part of our supply chain monitoring process, all third parties receive our Vendor Code of Conduct, which sets forth our expectations for human rights, labor and environmental standards throughout our global supply chain. We monitor compliance with the code using a risk-based approach, which includes assessing our largest third parties for ESG risk prior to contracting. Our contract templates include terms to ensure that our third parties are obligated to comply with the expectations set forth in our code.
